FROM POPE FRANCIS

"Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God"

This Beatitude makes us think of the many endless situations of war in our world. Yet we ourselves are

often a cause of conflict or at least of misunderstanding. For example, I may hear something about someone and I go off and repeat it. I may even embellish it the second time around and keep spreading it... And the more harm it does, the more satisfaction I seem to derive from it. The world of gossip, inhabited by negative and destructive people, does not bring peace. Such people are really the enemies of peace; in no way are they "blessed".

Peacemakers truly "make" peace; they build peace and friendship in society. To those who sow peace Jesus makes this magnificent promise: "They will be called children of God" (Mt 5:9). He told his disciples that, wherever they went, they were to say: "Peace to this house!" (Lk 10:5). The word of God exhorts every believer to work for peace, "along with all who call upon the Lord with a pure heart", for "the harvest of righteousness is sown in peace by those who make peace" (Jas 3:18). And if there are times in our community when we question what ought to be done, "let us pursue what makes for peace" (Rom 14:19), for unity is preferable to conflict. It is not easy to "make" this evangelical peace, which excludes no one but embraces even those who are a bit odd. troublesome or difficult, demanding, different, beaten down by life or simply uninterested. It is hard work; it calls for great openness of mind and heart, since it is not about creating "a consensus on paper or a transient peace for a contented minority", or a project "by a few for the few". Nor can it attempt to ignore or disregard conflict; instead, it must "face conflict head on, resolve it and make it a link in the chain of a new process". We need to be artisans of peace, for building peace is a craft that demands serenity, creativity, sensitivity and skill. Sowing peace all around us: that is holiness. Pope Francis, apostolic exhortation, GAUDETE ET EXSULTATE

FROM FR. HENRY DUC

In 1970, I left home at the age of twelve to follow my vocation of priesthood and my seminary was about more than one hundred kilometres away from the village. Due to the small frame I had back then, I was often picked on by bigger ones, particularly for the first few years in the institution.

For protection, I relied on the support of an older guy, two years ahead of me, who came from the same parish and was given lot of respect from other boys for his toughness. Though he was no angel in the seminary, he always behaved like a sheep at home due to his deep fear for his father. I remember the times when his father met me during our holidays, his standard question always was, 'Tell me, how is he going in the seminary?' Year in, year out my answer was always this standard, 'He's going well.' Even though, deep down, I knew that he was not going well at all.

To cover up for my friend, I had to compromise the truth I knew, and never felt easy about that. My friend eventually left the seminary, got married, had two sons and passed away ten years ago. His father passed away a few years before that. I truly regret that I never had a chance to tell his father that I was not honest to him for so many years about his son.

I can't help to recall this story as I read the Gospel for this feast of Christ, the King in advance, a feast with a relatively young history, since it was established in 1925 by Pope Pius XI both to honour Christ's sovereignty over all peoples and nations, and the whole universe, and to mark the end of a liturgical year.

The story sets up the scene, perhaps pretty much familiar to all of us, which is about how Jesus was brought before Pilate

by his accusers. Pilate was frank to ask him about whether he was the king of the Jews, the king with its ordinary sense. In response, Jesus first clarified with Pilate the spiritual dimension of his kingship, which posed no threat to any king on earth, before he said, 'yes, I am a king.' I am not too sure whether Pilate was able to grasp what Jesus meant to tell him here. However, I am confident to say it is not beyond us today.

Significantly he identified truth as the nature of his kingdom, since he came to bear witness to the truth, and has considered his followers as those who are on the side of the truth.

Let us pray today that we may be able to pay more attention to the call to bear witness to the truth as Jesus' disciples in this passing world. May the Lord help us to remain authentic members of his kingdom, through our courage to say nothing but the truth, and defend it at all costs, even when it makes us unsettled or uncomfortable.
