The blood of goats and bulls and the ashes of a heifer are sprinkled on those who have incurred defilement and they restore the holiness of their outward lives; how much more effectively the blood of Christ, who offered himself as the perfect sacrifice to God through the eternal Spirit, can purify our inner self from dead actions so that we do our service to the living God.

The Gospel of the Lord

FROM FR. HENRY

Dear friends,



At Retinnes, near Liege, Belgium in 1993, a child by the name of Juliana was born and placed in the convent of Mont-Cornillon at the age of five after both of her parents passed away. When Juliana grew up, she joined the convent and became a nun with a special devotion to the Blessed Virgin, the Sacred Passion and particularly the Blessed Sacrament. From her ardent love for the Blessed Sacrament and private revelations, she began to dedicate her time and energy to promote in her local diocese of Liege the feast of Corpus

Christi (Body of Blood of Christ), which then became popular throughout Europe and Pope Urban IV promulgated as a universal feast in 1246.

By its name, this feast celebrates both the body and blood of Jesus Christ as redemptive means to nourish Jesus' followers on their earthly journey. A prominent feature of the feast since the fourteenth century has been a Eucharistic procession, which takes place after Mass on these days.

From a scriptural perspective, this feast closely links with the Last Supper in which Jesus established the Eucharist, and the Gospel this Sunday highlights such a significant connection. In his account, the writer of Mark's Gospel takes us back to Jesus' last meal with the disciples and shows us in detail of how Jesus prepared for the occasion and what he has done with the bread and the cup naming them his body and blood pouring to bring salvation for many.

St Paul in the second reading explains to us the saving value of the Blood of Christ as the perfect sacrifice before God to cancel all the sins, and ever since bring salvation to the new people of God.

As we celebrate this Corpus Christi feast, let us give praise and thanks to the Son of God for giving us his Body and Blood as a sacrifice to cancel our sins and help to reconcile us with God, and also as food to nourish us on our journey to our heavenly home. Pray that we may be able to appreciate the redemptive value of the Blessed Sacrament and live our lives worthy of the people redeemed by the precious Body and Blood of the Son of God Have a Eucharistic-oriented week,

POPE FRANCIS' LAST REGINA CAELI OF 2024



Dear brothers and sisters, happy Feast of Pentecost, *buongiorno*! Today, Solemnity of Pentecost, we celebrate the descent of the Holy Spirit upon Mary and the Apostles. In the Gospel of the liturgy, Jesus speaks about the Holy Spirit and says that he will teach us "whatever he hears" (cf. *Jn* 16:13). But what does this expression mean? What has the Holy Spirit heard? What will he speak about? He speaks to us with words that express wonderful sentiments, such as affection, gratitude, entrustment, mercy. Words that make us know a beautiful, luminous, concrete and lasting relationship such as the eternal Love of God: the words that the Father and the Son say to each other. They are precisely *the transformative words of*

love, which the Holy Spirit repeats in us, and which it is good for us to listen to, because these words engender and make grow the same sentiments and the same intentions in our heart: they are fruitful words. This is why it is important that we nourish ourselves every day with the Words of God, the Words of Jesus, inspired by the Spirit. And many times I say: read a passage from the Gospel, have a little pocket-sized Gospel and keep it with us, making the most of favourable moments to read it. The priest and poet Clemente Rebora, speaking of his conversion, wrote in his diary: "And the Word silenced my chatter!" (cf.*Curiculum vitae*). The Word of God silences our superficial chatter and makes us say serious words, beautiful words, joyful words. "And the Word silenced my chatter!" Listening to the Word of God makes the chatter stop. This is how to give space in us to the voice of the Holy Spirit. And then in Adoration let us not forget the prayer of Adoration in silence — especially that [prayer] which is simple, silent, like adoration. And there, saying good words within ourselves, saying them to the heart so as to be able to say them to others, afterwards, to each other. And in this way we see that they come from the voice of the Consoler, of the Spirit. Dear sisters and brothers, reading and meditating on the Gospel, praying in silence, saying good words: they are not difficult things, no, we can all do them. They are easier than insulting, getting angry... And so, let us ask ourselves: what place do these words have in my life? How can I cultivate them, in order to better listen to the Holy Spirit, and become an echo of him for others? May Mary, who was present at Pentecost with the Apostles, make us docile to the voice of the Holy Spirit.

After the Regina Caeli, the Holy Father continued:

Dear brothers and sisters, the Holy Spirit is he who creates harmony, harmony! And he creates it from different, at times even conflicting, realities. Today, Feast of Pentecost, let us pray to the Holy Spirit, Love of the Father and Son, that he may create harmony in hearts, harmony in families, harmony in society, harmony in the entire world. May the Spirit make communion and fraternity grow between Christians of different denominations; give leaders the courage to make gestures of dialogue, that lead to an end to wars. Today's many wars: think of Ukraine my thoughts go in particular to the city of Kharkiv, which suffered an attack two days ago; let us think of the Holy Land, of Palestine, of Israel; let us think of the many places where there are wars. May the Spirit guide leaders of nations and all of us to open the doors to peace.

I express my gratitude for the welcome and affection of the people of Verona, yesterday: they were good, the Veronese! Thank you, thank you. In a particular way I think of the prison of Verona, I think of the inmates who bore witness to me once again that behind the prison walls, life, humanity and hope pulsate. My heartfelt thanks go to all the prison staff, and in particular the Director, Dr Francesca Gioieni. I greet all of you, pilgrims from Rome and different parts of Italy and the world. In particular, I greet those of Timor-Leste I will come to visit you soon! those of Latvia and Uruguay, as well as the Paraguayan community of Rome, which is celebrating the Virgen de Caacupé, and the Catholic Portuguese Mission of Lucerne. I greet the young people of the *Immacolata*; I greet the religious sisters who are here, bravo! I greet the faithful of Benevento, Porto Azzurro and Terracina, and the "Caterina di Santa Rosa" Institute of Rome. I wish you all a happy Sunday. Please, do not forget to pray for me. Enjoy your lunch. Arrivederci!

POPE FRANCIS' JUNE PRAYER INTENTION: 'FOR THOSE FLEEING THEIR OWN COUNTRIES.' By Deborah Castellano Lubov

Pope Francis' monthly prayer intention this June is for "those fleeing their own countries." The Pope invited the Church to pray for this intention in this month's The Pope Video, released on Tuesday. The prayer intention is entrusted to the entire Catholic Church through the Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network during the month in which the United Nations commemorates World Refugee Day on 20 June. Produced in collaboration with Tele VID and with the support of the Vatican Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development, the Pope Video for June is a story about the borders in various parts of the world. In his video, the Pope reminds Christians that "whoever welcomes a migrant welcomes Christ" and expresses how often this context is forgotten.

Number of displaced exceeds World War II In recent years, the number of people who have been displaced has exceeded that during the Second World War. According to the United Nations Refugee Agency (UNHCR), in 2023, there were 110 million people forcefully displaced throughout the world. In this context, Pope Francis has repeatedly asked throughout his pontificate that migrants be accompanied, promoted and integrated. At the beginning of the video, the Pope says, "The feeling of uprootedness or not knowing where they belong often accompanies the trauma experienced by people who are forced to flee their homeland because of war or poverty."

'God walks with His People' For this reason, he exhorts, "we promote a social and political culture that protects the rights and dignity of migrants, a culture that promotes the possibility that they can achieve their full potential." Consistent with the intention of this video message, each year since 1914, the Church has invited the faithful to pray for migrants on the World Day of Migrants and Refugees. "God walks with His People" is the theme chosen for the 2024 Day, which will be held on 29 September.

The Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network

The Pope Video is an official global initiative with the purpose of disseminating the Holy Father's monthly prayer intentions. It is carried out by the Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network (Apostleship of Prayer). Since 2016, The Pope Video has had more than 203 million views across all the Vatican's social networks and is translated into more than 23 languages, receiving press coverage in 114 countries.

The videos are produced and created by The Pope Video Prayer Network team, coordinated by Andrea Sarubbi, and distributed by La Machi Communication for Good Causes. The project is sponsored by Vatican Media.

The Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network is a Vatican foundation, with the mission of mobilizing Catholics through prayer and action in response to the challenges facing humanity and the mission of the Church. These challenges are presented in the form of prayer intentions entrusted by the Pope to the entire Church.

POPE FRANCIS' CATECHESIS

Cycle of Catechesis. The Spirit and the Bride. The Holy Spirit guides. The people of God towards Jesus our hope. 1. The Spirit of God was hovering over the waters

Dear brothers and sisters, good morning!

Today, with this catechesis we begin a cycle of reflections with the theme 'The Holy Spirit and the Bride" – the bride is the Church – "The Holy Spirit guides God's people towards Jesus our hope'. We will make this journey through the three great stages of salvation history: the Old Testament, the New Testament, and the time of the Church. Always keeping our gaze fixed on Jesus, Who is our hope.

In these first catecheses on the Spirit in the Old Testament, we will not do 'biblical archaeology'. Instead, we will discover that what is given as a promise in the Old Testament has been fully realised in Christ. It will be like following the path of the sun from dawn to noon.

Let us begin with the first two verses of the entire Bible. The first two verses of the Bible read: 'In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth. The earth was without form and void, and darkness was over the face of the deep. And *the Spirit* of God was hovering over the face of the waters' (Gen 1:1-2). The Spirit of God appears to us here as the mysterious power that moves the world from its initial formless, deserted, and gloomy state to its ordered and harmonious state. Because the Spirit makes harmony, harmony in life, harmony in the world. In other words, it is He who makes the world pass from chaos to the cosmos, that is, from confusion to something beautiful and ordered. This, in fact, is the meaning of the Greek word *kosmos*, as well as the Latin word *mundus*, that is, something beautiful, something ordered, clean, harmonious, because the Spirit is harmony.

This still vague hint of the Holy Spirit's action in creation becomes more precise in the following revelation. In a psalm we read: 'By the word of the Lord the heavens were made, and by the breath of His mouth all their host' (*Ps* 33:6); and again: 'You send forth Your spirit, they are created, and You renew the face of the earth' (*Ps* 104:30).

This line of development becomes very clear in the New Testament, which describes the intervention of the Holy Spirit in the new creation, using precisely the images that one reads about in connection with the origin of the world: the dove that hovers over the waters of the Jordan at Jesus' baptism (cf. *Mt* 3:16); Jesus who, in the Upper Room, breathes on the disciples and says: 'Receive the Holy Spirit' (Jn 20:22), just as in the beginning God breathed His breath on Adam (cf. *Gen* 2:7).

The Apostle Paul introduces a new element into this relationship between the Holy Spirit and creation. He speaks of a

universe that 'groans and suffers as in labour pains' (cf. *Rom* 8:22). It suffers because of man who has subjected it to the 'bondage of corruption' (cf. vv. 20-21). It is a reality that concerns us closely and concerns us dramatically. The Apostle sees the cause of the suffering of creation in the corruption and sin of humanity that has dragged it into its alienation from God. This remains as true today as it was then. We see the havoc that has been done, and that continues to be wrought upon creation by humanity, especially that part of it that has greater capacity to exploit its resources.

St Francis of Assisi shows us a way out, a beautiful way, a way out to return to the harmony of the Spirit: the way of contemplation and praise. He wanted a canticle of praise to the Creator to be raised from the creatures. We recall, 'Laudato sí, mi Signore...' the canticle of Francis of Assisi.

One of the psalms (18:2 [19:1]) says, '*The heavens declare the glory of God*', but men and women are needed to give voice to this mute cry of theirs. And in the '*Sanctus*' of the Mass we repeat each time: 'Heaven and earth are full of your glory'. They are, so to speak, 'pregnant' with it, but they need the hands of a good midwife to give birth to this praise of theirs.

Our vocation in the world, Paul again reminds us, is to be '*praise of His glory*' (*Eph* 1:12). It is to put the joy of contemplating ahead of the joy of possessing. And no one has rejoiced in creatures more than Francis of Assisi, who did not want to possess any of them.

Brothers and sisters, the Holy Spirit, Who in the beginning transformed chaos into cosmos, is at work to bring about this transformation in every person. Through the prophet Ezekiel, God promises: 'I will give you a new heart, and a new Spirit I will put within you... I will put my Spirit within you' (*Ez* 36:26-27). For our heart resembles that deserted, dark abyss of the first verses of Genesis. Opposed feelings and desires stir within it: those of the flesh and those of the spirit. We are all, in a sense, that 'kingdom divided against itself' that Jesus talks about in the Gospel (cf. *Mk* 3:24). Within ourselves we can say that there is an external chaos – social choas, political chaos. We think about wars, we think about so many boys and girls who don't have enough to heat, about so many social injustices. This is the external chaos. But there is also an internal

chaos: internal to each of us. The former cannot be healed unless we begin to heal the latter! Brothers and sisters, let us do a good job of making our internal confusion a clarity of the Holy Spirit. It is the power of God that does this, and we open our hearts so that He can do it.

May this reflection arouse in us the desire to experience the Creator Spirit. For more than a millennium, the Church has put on our lips the cry to ask: '*Veni creator Spiritus*! 'Come, O Creator Spirit! Visit our minds. Fill with heavenly grace the hearts you have created.' Let us ask the Holy Spirit to come to us and make us new persons, with the newness of the Spirit. Thank you.


