FROM FR. HENRY

Dear friends,



Today we begin this brand new Liturgical Year known as Year C in the Church with the celebration of the First Sunday of Advent and as we know the word Advent comes from the Latin Adventus meaning 'coming.' This four-week long season of Advent is aimed to help us prepare for a three-fold coming of Jesus, namely his nativity, his Second Coming and his time to call us to leave this world.

So how do we prepare ourselves for this three-fold coming of the Lord? To help answer this question, the evangelist advices us to stay awake and pray constantly, meaning to keep ourselves vigilant and not to fall in the trap of the flesh pleasures, gluttony, other life temptations, and ask God for the grace to keep us ever strong in faith no matter what we go through and to be included in the book of God's Chosen ones when our time comes.

Historically speaking, the Gospel of Luke probably was written after the fall of Jerusalem Temple in 70AD, the deadly event was predicted by Jesus around 40 years before, and the apocalyptic language we find in the first part of the Gospel account, such as the cosmic signs, the turmoils amongst nations and other natural phenomena, obviously reflects such an earth-shaking destruction and on top of that was the great persecution that the Early Church had to undergo. All these things perhaps had made Christians then, felt like the Second Coming that the Lord has promised was right at the corner, consequently they were advised to stand erect with their heads high and stay ready for the Lord at all times.

As we celebrate this First Sunday of Advent today preparing for the three-fold coming of Jesus, let us ask the Lord to grant us the strength to live the life we are meant to live as Christians as St Paul reminds us in the second reading today, the kind of life God wants us to live, the one filled with prayers and good works. Have a prayer-filled week,

POPE FRANCIS' ANGELUS

Dear brothers and sisters, happy Sunday!

Today the Gospel of the liturgy (Jn 18:33-37) shows us Jesus before Pontius Pilate. He has been handed over to the Roman procurator to be condemned to death. However, a brief dialogue begins between the two, between Jesus and Pilate. Through Pilate's questions and the Lord's answers, two words in particular are transformed, acquiring new meaning. Two words: the word "king" and the word "world."

At first Pilate asks Jesus, "Are you the king of the Jews?" (v. 33). Thinking as an official of the empire does, he wants to understand whether the man in front of him is potentially threatening. For him, a king is the authority that rules over all his subjects. And this would be a menace for him, would it not? Jesus claims to be king, yes, but in quite another way! Jesus is a king insofar as he is a witness: he is the One who speaks the truth (cf. v. 37). The kingly power of Jesus, the Word incarnate, lies in his true word, in his effective word, that transforms the world.

The World: this is the second word. Pontius Pilate's "world" is one where the strong triumph over the weak, the rich over the poor, the violent over the meek. A world, in other words, which we know well, unfortunately. Jesus is King, but his kingdom is not of Pilate's world, and not of this world either (v. 36). Jesus' world, indeed, is the new world, the eternal world, which God prepares for all by giving his life for our salvation. It is the kingdom of heaven, which Christ brings to this earth by pouring out grace and truth (cf. Jn. 1:17). The world, of which Jesus is King, redeems creation ruined by evil with the power proper to divine love. Jesus saves creation, because Jesus liberates, Jesus forgives, Jesus brings peace and justice. "But is this true Father?" - "Yes". How is your soul? Is there something heaving it down? Some old sin? Jesus always forgives. This is the kingdom of Jesus. If there is something ugly within you, ask for forgiveness. And He always forgives.

Brothers and sisters, Jesus speaks to Pilate from up close, but the latter remains distant from him because he lives in a different world. Pilate does not open himself to the truth, even though it is right in front of him. He will let Jesus be crucified. He will order "The King of the Jews" (Jn 19:19) to be written above the cross, but without understanding the meaning of this word: "King of the Jews", of these words. Yet Christ came into the world, into this world. The one who is from the truth, listens to his voice (cf. Jn 18:37). It is the voice of the King of the universe, who saves us.

Brothers and sisters, listening to the Lord brings light into our hearts and into our lives. So, let us try to ask ourselves everyone ask themselves in their own heart: can I say that Jesus is my "king"? Or do I have other "kings" in my heart? In what sense? Is His Word my guide, my certainty? Do I see in Him the merciful face of God who always forgives, always forgives, who is waiting for us to give us his forgiveness?

Let us pray together to Mary, the handmaid of the Lord, as we await the Kingdom of God with hope.

After the Angelus

Today these two young Koreans have taken the Cross used during World Youth Day, which will be in Seoul. They will take it to Korea to prepare for the World Youth Day. A round of applause for the Koreans! And also a round of applause to the Portuguese youth who have returned the Cross.

Yesterday, in Barcelona, priest Cayetano Clausellas Ballvé and the faithful layman Antonio Tort Reixachs were beatified. They were killed, in hatred of the faith, in Spain, in 1936. Let us give thanks to God for the great gift of these exemplary witnesses to Christ and the Gospel. Let us applaud the new Blesseds!

Today the 39th World Youth Day is being celebrated in specific Churches, with the theme: "They that hope in the Lord will walk and not grow faint" (cf. Is 40:31). Even young people get tired at times, if they do not hope in the Lord! I greet the delegations from Portugal and South Korea, who "passed on the torch" of preparations, for the WYD in Seoul in 2027. A round of applause for the two delegations.

As I have already announced, on the next 27th of April, during the Jubilee of Adolescents, I will proclaim Blessed Carlo Acutis a Saint. Also, having been informed by the Dicastery for the Causes of Saints that the process of study of the Cause of Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati is about to be successfully concluded, I plan to canonize him on the next 3rd of August, during the Jubilee of Young People, after having received an opinion from the Cardinals. A round of applause for the soon to be new saints.

Tomorrow Myanmar celebrates its National Feast Day, in remembrance of the first student protest that set the country on its way to independence, and in the prospect of a peaceful and democratic season that it is still struggling to achieve today. I express my closeness to the entire population of Myanmar, particularly to those who are suffering for the ongoing fights, especially my closeness to the most vulnerable: to the children, the elderly, the sick and all refugees, including the Rohingya. To all parties involved, I make a heartfelt appeal: may all weapons be silenced and may a sincere and inclusive dialogue be opened, that may ensure a lasting peace.

And I warmly greet all of you, Roman faithful and pilgrims. In particular, I greet the groups of the faithful coming from Malta, Israel, Slovenia and Spain, as well as from the dioceses of Mostar-Duvno and Trebinje-Mrkan and from the territory of the Abbey of Fossanova.

And let us continue to pray for martyred Ukraine, that is suffering so much, let us pray for Palestine, for Israel, for Lebanon, for Sudan. Let us ask for peace.

And to everyone, I wish everyone a happy Sunday. Please don't forget to pray for me.

POPE FRANICS' CATECHESIS

Cycle of Catechesis. The Spirit and the Bride. The Holy Spirit guides the people of God towards Jesus our hope 14. The Bride's gifts. The charisms, gifts of the Spirit for common use

Dear brothers and sisters, good morning!

In the last three catecheses, we talked about the sanctifying work of the Holy Spirit which is implemented in the sacraments, in prayer and by following the example of the Mother of God. But let us listen to what a famous text from Vatican II says: "It is not only through the sacraments and the ministries of the Church that the Holy Spirit sanctifies and leads the people of God and enriches it with virtues, but, 'allotting his gifts to everyone according as He wills'" (cf. 1 Cor 12:11) (Lumen gentium, 12). We too have personal gifts that the Spirit gives to each one of us.

Therefore, the moment has arrived to talk also about this second way the Holy Spirit works, which is charismatic action. Two elements contribute to defining what charism is. A somewhat difficult word, I will explain it. First, the charism is the gift given "for the common good" (*1 Cor* 12:7), to be useful to everyone. It is not, in other words, destined principally and ordinarily for the sanctification of the person, but for the "service" of the community (cf. *1 Pt* 4:10). This is the first aspect. Secondly, the charism is the gift given "to one", or "to some" in particular, not to everyone in the same way, and this is what distinguishes it from sanctifying grace, from the theological virtues and from the sacraments, which instead are the same and common to all. The charism is given to a specific person or community. It is a gift that God gives you.

The Council explains this too. The Holy Spirit, it says, "distributes special graces among the faithful of every rank. By these gifts He makes them fit and ready to undertake the various tasks and offices which contribute toward the renewal and building up of the Church, according to the words of the Apostle: 'The manifestation of the Spirit is given to everyone for profit'" (*1 Cor* 12:7).

The charisms are the "jewels" or the ornaments that the Holy Spirit distributes to make the Bride of Christ more beautiful. One can thus understand why the Conciliar text ends with the following exhortation: "These charisms, whether they be the more outstanding or the more simple and widely diffused, are to be received with thanksgiving and consolation for they are perfectly suited to and useful for the needs of the Church" (*LG* 12).

Pope Benedict XVI affirmed: "Anyone who considers the history of the post-conciliar era can recognize the process of true renewal, which often took unexpected forms in living movements and made almost tangible the inexhaustible vitality of the holy Church". And this is the charism given to a group, through a person.

We must rediscover the charisms, because this ensures that the promotion of the laity, and of women in particular, is

understood not only as an institutional and sociological fact, but also in its biblical and spiritual dimension. Indeed, the laity are not the least, no, they laity are not a form of external collaborator or auxiliary troops of the clergy, no! They have their own charisms and gifts with which to contribute to the mission of the Church.

Let us add another thing: when we talk about the charisms, we must immediately dispel a misunderstanding: that of identifying them with spectacular or extraordinary gifts and capabilities; instead, they are ordinary gifts – each one of us has his or her own charism – that assume extraordinary value if inspired by the Holy Spirit and embodied with love in situations of life. Such an interpretation of the charism is important, because many Christians, when they hear talk of charisms, experience sadness or disappointment, as they are convinced that they do not possess any, and feel they are excluded or second-class Christians. No, they are not second-class Christians, no, each person has his or her own personal, and also community charism. Saint Augustine responded to these in his time with a very eloquent comparison: 'If you love,' he told his people, "If you love, it is not nothing that you have: if you love unity, whoever has anything in that unity has it also for you. In the body, the eye alone sees; but is it for itself alone that the eye sees? It sees both for the hand and the foot, and for all the other members". [1]

This reveals the secret of why charity is defined by the Apostle as "a still more excellent way" (*1 Cor* 12, 31): it makes me love the Church, or the community in which I live and, in unity, all charisms, not just some, are "mine", just as "my"

charisms, little though they may seem, belong to all and are for the good of all. Charity multiplies charisms; it makes the charism of one, of one individual person, the charism of all. Thank you!

POPE FRANCIS: 'NEVER LOSE HOPE' WHEN A LOVED ONE ABANDONES HIS FAITH.

Pope Francis has replied to a letter from an Italian grandmother concerned that her granddaughter, now five years old, has not been baptised by her non-religious parents.

The brief letter, signed "Oliva from Bergamo", was published in the first edition of the new magazine *Piazza San Pietro* ('St Peter's Square'), published by St Peter's Basilica.

In the message, Oliva says that the decision taken by her daughter and son-in-law not to baptise her grandchild is "a source of great suffering" to her.

"What will Jesus think of all this?", she asks.

In his reply, the Pope says that he understands Oliva's suffering and feels close to her.

Baptism, he says, is "a great gift". Since his election as Pope, he notes, he has baptised many children, and always found this to be a moment of "great joy".

The Pope goes on to point out that one should "never lose hope" when a loved one loses their faith, recalling the example of St Monica, who prayed for decades for the conversion of her son St Augustine.

He also stresses that "baptism cannot be imposed on parents who do not want it for their children."

He therefore urges Oliva to "accompany your children, speak with them, but not insist on baptism". "Gratuitous love is more persuasive than many words," the Pope writes. "Love for God plants seeds of the future, of friendship, of the search for Him."


