GOSPEL A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke 3:10-18

When all the people asked John, 'What must we do?' he answered, 'If anyone has two tunics he must share with the man who has none, and the one with something to eat must do the same.' There were tax collectors too who came for baptism, and these said to him, 'Master, what must we do?' He said to them, 'Exact no more than your rate.' Some soldiers asked him in their turn, 'What about us? What must we do?' He said to them, 'No intimidation! No extortion! Be content with your pay!'

A feeling of expectancy had grown among the people, who were beginning to think that John might be the Christ, so John declared before them all, 'I baptise you with water, but someone is coming, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to undo the strap of his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fan is in his hand to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his barn; but the chaff he will burn in a fire that will never go out.' As well as this, there were many other things he said to exhort the people and to announce the Good News to them.

The Gospel of the Lord

FROM FR. HENRY



Dear friends,

This Sunday marks the Third Sunday of Advent also known as the Sunday of Joy or the Gaudete Sunday for Gaudete in Latin means 'rejoice.' If we pay attention to all the readings and prayers this Sunday, we can find the theme of joy running through our entire liturgy with the constant repeat of these keys words 'joy' and 'happiness' again and again. So, why are we encouraged to rejoice today? The answer is that because the

coming of the Lord is very near and we are more than half way through our preparation for the celebration of Christmas and closer to an eschatological encounter with the Son of God in a future return he has promised us.

Apart from wrapping ourselves with the spirit of joy, happiness and gladness, we continue to proceed through the Advent process of preparation by being more generous to share with the needy, more honest in dealing with one another and more gentle with those around us.

It's important to keep in mind the agricultural symbols John uses in the second part of the Gospel when he paints the picture of the messiah to clear the threshing floor with a winnowing fan and then gather the wheat into his barns. Know that when a farmer harvested wheat in Jesus' time, he separated grain from the hulls by heaping the sheaves onto a threshing floor and then pulverising and crushing them with an ox or donkey pulling a heavy board with sharp stones attached. As the board ran over the wheat, the hulls were cracked open for the kernels to come out and the empty hulls became chaff. The farmer then uses a winnowing fork to toss the chaff the kernels up into the air. Thanks to the wind the chaff were blown away, but the kernels fell to the ground and were gathered and put in the barns by the farmer who later ground them into flour.

Symbolically speaking, the winnowing fan is a symbol for divine judgement, the chaff stands for the wicked and the kernels for the good who remain faithful to God. Here John means to ask his audience to prepare for the day of judgement by turning away from sins and changing their lives in the way worthy to be counted amongst the chosen ones of God. Let us pray for the grace to help us repent from sins and grow more steadfast in charity and gentleness, consequently we will be ready to celebrate the birthday of Jesus and welcome him back at his dual return. Manual Handling

Here at OLOL we have implemented a minimal lift policy. You should avoid manual handling whenever possible. If this is not possible, you should follow the below procedure:

- 1. Plan—asses the load and determine if you need assistance.
- 2. Clear the path
- 3. Move in close to the load
- 4. Place your feet shoulder width apart
- 5. Secure your grip and hold the load close to your body
- 6. Maintain normal curves of the spine
- 7. Hold your head upright
- 8. Power lift with legs and body weight
- 9. Don't twist
- 10. Use smooth, controlled movements



POPE FRANCIS' ANGELUS

Dear brothers and sisters, good morning and happy feast day!

Today, on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, the Gospel tells us about one of the most important, most beautiful moments in the history of humanity: the Annunciation (cf. *Lk* 26-38), when Mary's "yes" to the Archangel Gabriel permitted the Incarnation of the Son of God, Jesus. It is a scene that inspires the greatest wonder and emotion because God, the Most High, the Omnipotent, by means of the Angel converses with a young girl from Nazareth, asking for her collaboration for His plan of

salvation. If today you find a little time, look in the Gospel of Saint Luke and read this scene. I assure you that it will do you good, a lot of good!

As in the scene of the creation of Adam, painted by Michelangelo in the Sistine Chapel, where the finger of the heavenly Father touches the finger of the man; thus here too the human and the divine encounter each other, at the beginning of our Redemption, they meet with a wonderful delicacy, in the blessed instant in which the Virgin Mary utters her "yes". She is a woman in a small peripheral village and is called for ever to the centre of history: on her answer depends the fate of humanity, which can smile and hope again, because its destiny has been placed in good hands. She will be the one to bear the Saviour, conceived by the Holy Spirit.

Mary, then, as the Archangel Gabriel greets her, is "full of grace" (*Lk* 1:28), the Immaculate, entirely at the service of the Word of God, always with the Lord, to whom she entrusts herself completely. In her, there is nothing that resists His will, nothing that opposes truth and charity. Here is her blessedness, which all generations will sing. Let us also rejoice because the Immaculate has given us Jesus, who is our salvation!

Brothers and sisters, contemplating this mystery we can ask ourselves: in our time, ravaged by wars and bent on the effort to possess and dominate, where do I place my hope? In strength, in money, in powerful friends? Do I place my hope there? Or in God's infinite mercy? And in the face of the shiny false models circulating in the media and on the internet, where do I look for my happiness? Where is the treasure of my heart? Is it in the fact that God loves me freely, that His love always goes before me, and is ready to forgive me when I return repentant to Him? In that filial hope in God's love? Or am I deluding myself in trying to assert my ego and my will at all costs?

Brothers and sisters, as the opening of the Holy Door of the Jubilee approaches, let us open the doors of the heart and the mind to the Lord. He is born of Mary Immaculate: let us implore the intercession of Mary. And I will give you a piece of advice. Today it is a good day to decide to make a good Confession. If you cannot go today, this week, until next Sunday, open your heart and the Lord will forgive everything, everything, everything. And so, in Mary's hands, we will be happier.

After the Angelus

Dear brothers and sisters!

On this solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of Mary, I am especially close to the Nicaraguans. I invite you to join in prayer for the Church and the people of Nicaragua, who celebrate the Most Pure, as Mother and Patroness, and raises to her a cry of faith and hope. May the heavenly Mother be a consolation for them in difficulties and uncertainties, and open everyone's hearts, so that the way of respectful and constructive dialogue may be sought, in order to promote peace, fraternity and harmony in the country.

And let us continue to pray for peace, in tormented Ukraine, in the Middle East – Palestine, Israel, Lebanon, now in Syria – in Myanmar, Sudan and wherever people suffer from war and violence. I appeal to governors and the international community, so that we may reach the feast of the Nativity with a ceasefire on all fronts of war.

I greet you all, Romans and pilgrims. In particular, the pilgrimage of the Handmaids of the Sacred Heart from Spain, the "Oasi Mamma dell'Amore" group, the faithful from the United States, from Honduras and Australia, as well as those of Calderara di Reno, Corpolò and Grado, and the candidates for Confirmation from the parish of *San Pio da Pietrelcina* in Rome.

Today, it comes to my heart to ask you all to pray for the prisoners who are on death row in the United States. I believe there are thirteen or fifteen of them. Let us pray that their sentence be commuted, changed. Let us think of these brothers and sisters of ours and ask the Lord for the grace to save them from death.

Today in Italian parishes, adhesion to Catholic Action is renewed. I wish all members a good journey of foration, service and apostolic commitment. I heartily bless the faithful of Rocca di Papa and the torch with which they will light the great star on the Fortress of their beautiful town in honour of Mary Immaculate. And I am close to the workers of Siena, Fabriano and Ascoli Piceno who are defending in solidarity the right to work, which is a right to dignity! May their work not be taken away for economic and financial reasons.

I wish you all a good Sunday and a happy feast of Mary Immaculate. We will see each other this afternoon in Piazza di Spagna. And please, do not forget to pray for me. Enjoy your lunch, and *arrivederci*!

POPE AT AUDIENCE: HOMILIES SHOULD BE FOCUSED AND NO LONGER THAN 10 MINUTES By Francesca Merlo

Pope Francis continues his catechesis cycle on the Holy Spirit and the Bride, focusing this week's General Audience on the role of preaching in the Church, encouraging preachers to rely on the Gospel's content and the guidance of the Holy Spirit. In continuing his cycle of catechesis on the Spirit and the Bride, Pope Francis dedicated his Wednesday General Audience to the evangelising work of the Holy Spirit in the preaching of the Church's ministers. Addressing the faithful gathered in St. Peter's Square, the Pope reflected on the First Letter of Peter, in which the first Pope defined the apostles as "those who preached the good news to you [through] the Holy Spirit." Pope Francis explained that in this expression we find the two constitutive elements of Christian preaching, namely "its content, which is the Gospel, and its means, which is the Holy Spirit."

The content we preach Reflecting first on the content, Pope Francis recalled the use of the word "Gospel" in the New Testament. It has two principal meanings, said the Pope. When it indicates any one of the four canonical Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John), the word means "the good news proclaimed by Jesus during His earthly life." However, after the first Easter, the word "Gospel" assumes its new meaning "of good news about Jesus, that is, the Paschal mystery of the death and resurrection of Christ," said the Pope. He explained that this is what the Apostle Peter calls "Gospel" when he writes, "I am not ashamed of the Gospel. It is the power of God for the salvation of everyone who believes." Pope Francis went on to note that the preaching of Jesus and, subsequently, that of the Apostles, also contains "all the moral duties that stem from the Gospel," starting from the ten commandments up to the "new" commandment of love. But, stressed the Pope, "if we do not want to relapse into the error denounced by the Apostle Paul of putting the law before grace and deeds before faith, it is necessary always to start anew from the proclamation of what Christ has done for us." It is for this reason, the Pope continued, that in the Apostolic Exhortation *Evangelii Gaudium*, "I insisted a lot on the first of these two things, namely the *kerygma*, or 'proclamation,' on which every moral application depends."

The means by which we preach Turning then to the second of the two elements of Christian preaching, "means," Pope Francis noted that when considering *kerygma*, "we must bear in mind the means by which it is proclaimed." The Gospel must be preached "through the Holy Spirit," said the Pope. "Preaching with the anointing of the Holy Spirit means transmitting, together with the ideas and the doctrine, the life and profound conviction" and thus "not with persuasive (words of) wisdom, but with a demonstration of spirit and power." Speaking off-the-cuff, Pope Francis urged preachers to transmit "one idea, one sentiment, and one invitation to action" within at most 10 minutes. "After 8 minutes, preaching gets dispersive and no one understands," he said. "Never go over 10 minutes, ever! This is very important." In bringing his catechesis to a close, the Pope noted that some might object, saying that it is easily said but wondered how it can be put into practice if it does not depend on us but on the coming of the Holy Spirit. Preachers, he said, must pray for the grace of the Holy Spirit to proclaim Christ with their preaching. Secondly, he added, preachers must not preach themselves but Jesus the Lord. "Not wanting to preach oneself also implies not always giving priority to pastoral initiatives promoted by us and linked to our own name but willingly collaborating, if requested, in community initiatives, or entrusted to us by obedience," he said. In conclusion, Pope Francis prayed that the Holy Spirit might teach the Church how to preach the Gospel in an efficacious way to the men and women of today.

POPE FRANICS TO THEOLOGIANS: 'IDEOLOGY KILLS REALITY AND MANIPUALTES PEOPLE' By Lisa Zengarini

Speaking at an audience for participants in a two-day international conference held at the Pontifical Lateran University on 9-10 December on the future of theology, Pope Francis called for a dynamic inter-disciplinary and inclusive theological approach that addresses the complexities of contemporary society while remaining deeply rooted in faith.

The conference Titled "The Future of Theology: Legacy and Imagination" the conference is organized by the Vatican Dicastery for Culture and Education and brings together some 500 theologians from all continents to reflect on how to make theology relevant in today's world as called for by Pope Francis. Specifically, the purpose of the conference is to enable theologians from different cultural backgrounds to share their experiences and reflections with a synodal approach on how to transform the theological legacy of past generations into a creative impetus for the present. Participants will reaffirm the fundamental contribution of theology to the broader scientific and academic research system, address the cultural marginalization of theology by highlighting its unique contribution to creating new paradigms of rationality and rethink the network of theological academic institutions. **Theology illuminates and reveals the world** In his address Pope Francis reaffirmed the crucial role of theologians in the Church and society at large, likening theology to a light that illuminates and reveals the world while remaining invisible. "Theology is like that," he said, "it works quietly and humbly so that the light of Christ and his Gospel can emerge." He therefore urged theologians to remain rooted in friendship with Christ, and love for humanity, engaging with both the beauty and suffering of the world.

An all-male theology is an incomplete theology As participants explore fundamental questions of theology's relevance, direction, and role in addressing contemporary challenges, Pope Francis highlighted the importance of collaboration between male and female theologians citing the biblical example of Huldah, in the Second Book of Kings, and therefore the need for inclusive theological perspectives. "There are things that only women understand and theology needs their contribution", the Pope insisted. "An all-male theology is an incomplete theology." Pope Francis then shared his desire that theology may "help to rethink how to think", and specifically, to move "beyond simplification" and instead embrace the complexity of reality. Need for an inter-disciplinary approach to counteract ideological simplification "Simplification," he warned "mutilates reality; it gives rise to empty and unilateral thinking and it generates polarization and fragmentation", which is "precisely what ideologies do: they flatten reality to a single idea, which they then repeat obsessively and manipulate." As an antidote to simplification Pope cited "inter-disciplinary and cross-disciplinary" approaches as suggested by the Apostolic Constitution 'Veritatis Gaudium', urging theologians to engage with other fields such as philosophy, science, and the arts. Integrating diverse perspective, he stressed referencing Saint Thomas Aquinas and Saint Bonaventure, are essential to grasp the complexity of reality. Making theology accessible to all Finally, Pope Francis invited theologians to make their discipline accessible to all, noting the growing interest, notably among middleaged adults in deepening their faith and education. Theology, he argued, could serve as a guide for those seeking purpose and renewal at a critical phase of their lives. He therefore urged theological institutes to make "imaginative adjustments to their programmes of study so that theology can be accessible to all."
